Dear Friends

You are probably wondering what I did while on sabbatical, here is a quick snapshot. I visited 23 Cathedrals and Churches from York to Wells, including some in Wales. I spent time immersing myself in the experiences received through stained glass, art, creativity, connection, welcome and hospitality. Worshipping with a different Christian tradition on a Sunday, namely a local Salvation Army Corps and visits to some Methodist Churches around the country.

One of the things God spoke clearly to me about was the importance of Prayer through a quote by Samual Chadwick "The Church that multiplies committees and neglects prayer may be fussy, noisy and enterprising but it labours in vain and spends its strength for nought. It is possible to excel in mechanics and fails in dynamic. There is a superabundance of machinery; what is wanting is power". I heard this quote on an online service from Cliff College, it has stayed with me since and invigorated my faith. On my return to Circuit I am now encouraging my Churches and Circuit to pray more. Let's become a praying Circuit and see God move when we are faithful in coming to receive His power through prayer.

I had a lot of wow moments and had the time to considered why. One of my highlights was the baptism window at Coventry Cathedral. A modern piece of stained glass, with lots of colour, set out in squares. Was it the window itself that was giving me the 'Wow moment' or its connection to baptism. After some reflection later I came to the conclusion it was the window and the symbolic nature of baptism through the font that made a profound connection.

Whichever Church I visited there was a special significance at the Alter/Communion Table. I consider it a deep privilege to be able to preside at the table of Bread and Wine that is open to all. During my Sabbatical I had time to reflect on some of the liturgies and to consider how I enable congregations to connect with Jesus through Bread and wine. What is the significance of Holy Communion for you?

Another two moments that were special to me before happened in Manchester. The Homeless Jesus statue outside St. Anne's Church and visiting the garden created in memory of those who lost their live as a result of the Manchester Arena attack, not a Church but definitely a sacred space. I'm sure you will hear about these at some point soon.

I attended a Crochet for beginners workshop and as a result have created my first blanket and started a second, I like the rhythm of crocheting which helps me to feel calm and also focus. One of the special things I did at home was to do a jigsaw of the Last Supper, which has already started doing the rounds in the Circuit. If you haven't seen it yet your chance will come.

Wishing you all a prayer and Spirit filled July.
