Dear All,

I sit writing this in glorious sunshine, apparently, we've already had more 'full sun' than last summer I know many farmers have been longing for rain. I wonder how you notice or mark the changing seasons? Maybe there are key points in your year, personal anniversaries or birthdays, or something in the garden or park you wait to see in bloom, time certainly doesn't stand still! Thinking about the turning of time I wonder if anyone can place these lyrics?

*March went out like a lion, A-whippin' up the water in the bay.*

*Then April cried and stepped aside, and along come pretty little May!*

*May was full of promises, but she didn't keep 'em quick enough fer some,*

*And a crowd of Doubtin' Thomases was predictin' that the summer'd never come.*

Are you baffled or maybe you got it? It's strange what our memories can drag up, this song crept from the depths of my brain. It comes from the first big show I was in as a child, aged around nine, in it I played one of the 'snow children' - has that given anyone a clue? It's from the Rodgers and Hammerstein musical Carousel and the song is: '*June Is Bustin' Out All Over*'. It's a light, fun song amidst a rather tragic story, it is certainly not the most famous song from the musical that, thanks in part to football, goes to '*You'll never walk alone.*' It's a song that speaks of the turning of time and of life bursting out, it describes June as '*a love song, sweetly sung.*'

As this song came crashing into my memory the thing that struck me is that early in June the Church will mark Pentecost when the life of the Spirit comes bursting forth! Pentecost is that 'full of life' 'can't be contained' essence that this song conveyed to me. Pentecost is a marker in our church's year, it marks the outpouring of the Spirit which enables and equips the first followers of Jesus to live out their faith with great power, it's also sometimes called the birthday of the Church.

The Spirit continues to be at work today, sometimes with great power like the flames of Pentecost, sometimes like a gentle breeze or the breath we breathe. But the one thing the Spirit does is offers life and reminds us of God's presence. This June, be open to the bursting forth of life, to fresh opportunities and the surprises of God. And like that more famous song from the musical, be reminded that you never walk alone and that God is always with you.

### Godly Play as Bible Study

Story is one of the most ancient forms of knowing. It is the way our Christian heritage has been passed down to us. And story forms the foundation of Godly Play. It invites you to sit as part of a circle and listen as the stories of the Bible are told through word and action. It allows you to immerse yourself in the stories as an act of meditation and prayer and ultimately to encounter God. As the stories are told you sit and listen and at the end of the storytelling you are invited to consider a number of 'I wonder questions'. Questions posed by the storyteller that ask you to reflect on what you have heard. Questions like:

I wonder what part of the story was most important to you?

Or

I wonder where you are in the story?

Or

I wonder if there is a part of the story we can leave out and still have all the story we need?

There are no right or wrong answers to any of the questions, they are a means by which you are invited to wonder deeply about the story and what it says to you. Then when the story is put away there is time to respond to all that you have heard and wondered about. It may be that you want to re-read the story again for yourself, paint, draw, model or write a response - the choice is entirely yours.

At the end of the response time we gather back together for refreshments before drawing our time together to an end.

If this is something you think you might like to try then our next Godly play session will take place on **Monday, 2<sup>nd</sup> June at 6.30 pm** at **Wolstanton Methodist Church**. Come and see, wonder, and reflect deeply about stories you thought you knew.

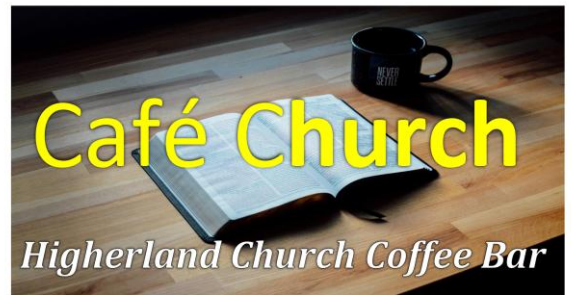


